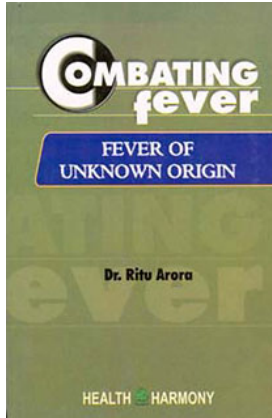

INTRODUCTION TO FEVERS

In health, the body temperature of human beings is maintained within a narrow range despite extremes in environmental conditions and physical activity. It is also applicable to the birds and animals who are called homeothermic or warm blooded. Fever has been a very sensitive and most reliable indicator of the disease in the body. The alteration in the body temperature is an accompaniment of systemic illness which is a definite marker of temperature variation. Sometimes even in the absence of a frank febrile response, interference with heat regulation by a desire is evident. It shows in the form of flushing, pallor, sweating, shivering and abnormal sensations of cold or warmth, or the reactive fluctuations of body temperature.

Heat Production: The major source of basal heat production is through thyroid thermogenesis and the action of ATPase on the sodium pump of all membranes. The muscles play a very important role in heat production through shivering. It varies according to the number of nerve impulses to the muscles causing tension or relaxation of the muscles.

Heat Loss: There are different modes of heat loss from the body. It includes the loss of surface heat by convection, i.e. the

ACCOMPANIMENTS OF FEVER:

As the episode and affection of fever is controlled by a systemic higher centre, therefore most of the times fever is accompanied by many generalised as well as systemic symptoms. The perception of fever usually varies from patient to patient. Some patients observe the complaints very seriously, while some may not even be affected by the temperature variations. Some may not pay proper attention because of constant uneasiness by headache, myalgias, backache, arthralgia nausea, etc. Let us have a brief look on the general companions of a patterned or even a non-patterned fever.

1. **Chills:** Abrupt onset of fever with a chill or rigor is characteristic of some diseases and in the absence of antipyretic drugs, rare in others. Repeat rigors are typical of a pyogenic infection with bacteremia but a similar pattern may be seen in non-infectious diseases such as lymphoma. The degree of chill varies from a simple chill to teeth chattering, bed shaking or just a chilly sensation. It is seen mostly in all the fevers of viral origin. Chill may be excited by the intermittent administration of some antipyretic drugs also. It is also a significant presentation in all malarial fevers.
2. **Delirium:** It usually results from the elevated body temperature and is common in patients with alcoholism, senility and cerebral arteriosclerosis.
3. **Convulsions:** These are not infrequent in febrile children, especially those with a family history of epilepsy, although they do not reflect any cerebral disease.

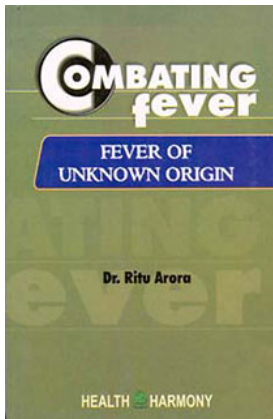
